



INTERNATIONAL GAME RULES

Art.1: Equipment

- a. Each male team will consist of 5 players and 2 reserves, all of which will be inscribed on the arbitration sheet with their personal number. Each women's team will consist of 4 players and 1 reserve, who will also sign up on the arbitration sheet with their personal number.
- b. During the men's competitions 2 changes will be accepted, and at the end of a complete game. For women's competitions there will be 1 change. The captain indicates the changes to the referee before the reserve player can enter the field. The captain gives the referee the number of the player who leaves and enters. The captain communicates the number of the player that enters and the one of the one that leaves.
- c. If a player has to leave the game due to injury or another reason, we continue the game with 4 players in the men's category and 3 in the women's category. This means that if the player who leaves the field has the service, this team loses that game.
- d. Players who have been replaced can no come back to the field and all players will wear their visible number on their shirt.

Art.2: The material

- a. The ball, which will be used during the game, will be a shaved tennis ball. Ball Nobia Balle Éducative - Balle de tennis pelée.
- b. The series of balls that will be used in the tournament will be approved first by the tournament director. These will be marked with a stamp / stamp / tournament mark.

Art.3: Protection

- a. to. We will play with a bare hand or with a Wallball glove. No other protection will be allowed. The protections used by each player will be controlled by the referees before the start of the match, but also during and after.

Art.4: The game

- a. At the time of service, only the player designated for this purpose may be in the service area. A maximum of two services is allowed, per point. The serving player can ask for a new ball or change the ball (always to the extent of the possibilities that the organization has available for the match).
- b. If the serve touches or exceeds the service line, the point goes to the opponent.
- c. At the time of service, the opponent may only subtract the ball after the first pot. At the time of service, no player may be in the service area of the opposite field, before the serve touches the ball with the hand (in the execution of service).
- d. The service will be done by all team members. This turn will be communicated before the match to the referee (you must use the numbers of the players).
- e. Each team will do the service during a complete game.
- f. The ball that bounces on the lines will be considered GOOD.
- g. The ball can be stopped with both hands.
- h. A team will win fifteen when the ball stops beyond the center line and can not be played validly (in the air or first bounce) or when crossing the front line. It will be missed when the ball goes out of the sidelines without having bounced before.
- i. The ball must be played if it bounces on the lines (the line is good!). If the ball bounces off the lines, the point is for the opponent.
- j. In each game, the score will be as follows: 15, 30, 40 and game. In case of a tie at 40-40, the team that wins the next fifteen also wins the game.
- k. The games will be played to six games. Field changes will take place: after the first game and then every two games. Players can not leave the field unless there is a timeout.
- l. The team that wins 3, 4 or 5 games will receive 1 of the 3 points in the game. The winner will get 2 points. Examples: if the score is 6-0, 6-1 or 6-2, the winner will get 3 points; If the score is 6-3, 6-4 or 6-5, the winner will get 2 points and the loser 1 point.
- m. To designate the champion of this modality, it will be the team with the most points. In the event of a tie, the games won will be taken into account. In case of a tie in the same group.
 - 1.- The confrontation between the two teams involved will be taken into account.
 - 2.- In the event of a triple tie in the same group, only the games/points between the teams involved will be taken into account. The differential between games won and lost will be taken into account. If the tie still persists, the differential between 15 won and lost will be taken into account. In case of a tie between different groups.
 - 1.- The points of the classification of this phase will be taken into account.
 - 2.- If the tie persists, the differential between the games won and lost in the group stage will be taken into account. And if the tie persists, the differential between 15 won and lost will be taken into account.

During the game, each team can have 2 Time-Out. The captain will ask the referee

for the time-out just after a completed game. The players will spend the time-out in the neutral zone. A Time-Out lasts 1 MINUTE.

- n. In the neutral zone, which is outside the game, the following persons will be admitted: the coach, a second coach, 2 reserves players in male cat. and 1 reserve player for women cat. plus 1 physiotherapist. The neutral zone will be clearly demarcated, as in a football field. This should be placed at a safe distance from the field (see below).

Art.5: The dimensions and the surface of the game

Court for Male cat.:

- a. 70 m long and 20 m wide. The service square will be 7 m long and 7 m wide and there will be a distance of 24 m between the service square and the rest square. The central line that divides the fields will be 35 meters away.

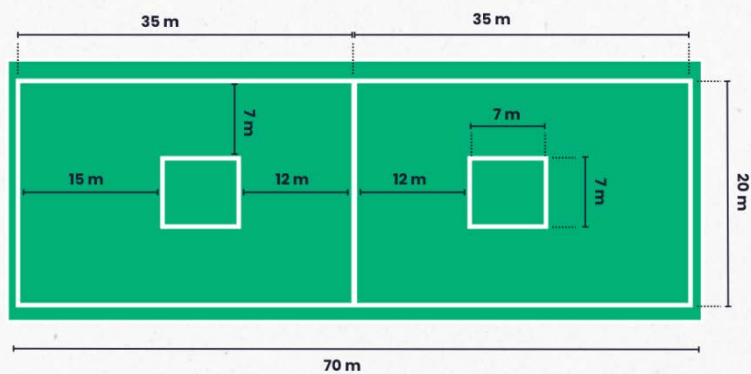
Court for Female cat.:

- a. 50 m long and 14 m wide. The service square will be 6 m long by 6 m wide and there will be a distance of 18 m between the service square and the rest square. The central line that divides the fields will be 25 meters away.

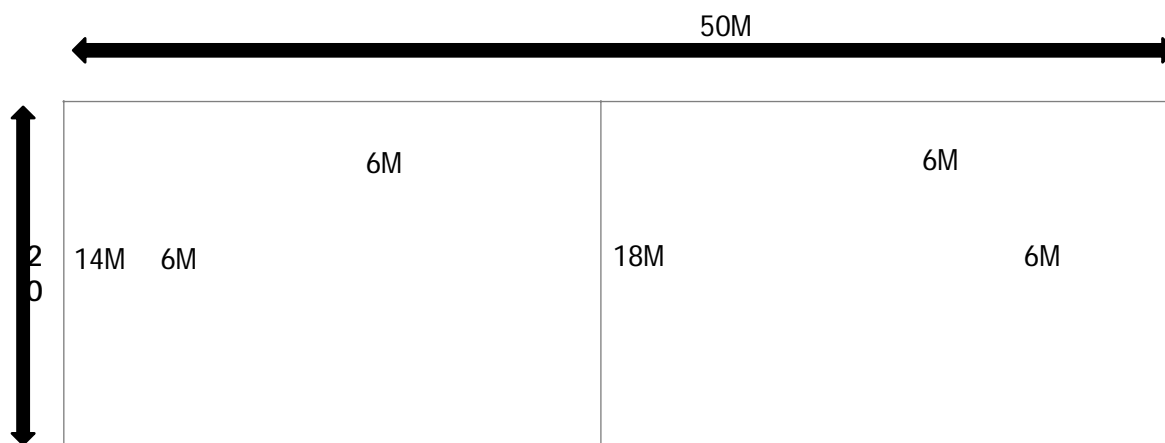
